First, some technical jargon: a "music hang," is a portable light-weight "music stand" that hangs from one's neck, allowing one to read from sheet music that has been affixed to a flat surface.

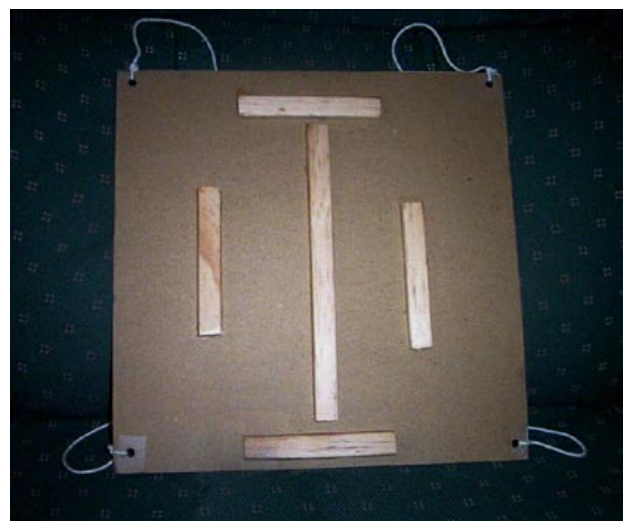
